
VESTIGE

SEVEN WONDERS

Each floor of the hotel has mirrors scribbled with small drawings. These symbols were actually made by Stephen Smith to serve as signage. The artist named this work Seven Wonders, as the symbols are scattered across the seven floors of the hotel, classified into several themes, from nature to space...







MAGIC MIRROR

When entering the bathrooms of *Le Royal Monceau - Raffles Paris*, guests will discover a world of minerals, stone, steel, mirrors. These mirrors have a specific type of glass that very few manufacturers know how to shape: the «White Glass Mirror», offering a light similar to the natural light, ideal for makeup.

WOODED DEER
